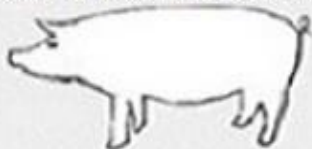
Help and support can take many forms such as the collection of medicines, delivery of food or simply providing someone to talk to. Deliveries can be left on your doorstep if you are self-isolating.

Application for a licence to sell alcohol

St Dominick Community Shop Ltd, St Dominick PL12 6TD

An application to sell alcohol as retail off sales at St Dominick Community Shop has been made to Cornwall Council under the Licensing Act 2003.

Representations can be made to the Cornwall Council licensing authority by September 22nd 2020 in writing to County Hall, Truro TR1 3AY.

Comments must relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives: prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and protection of children from harm.

It is an offence under Section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003 to knowingly make a false statement in connection with an application and the maximum fine for the offence is up to £5,000.

St. Dominick Community Shop - update

The work on the build and creation of the Community Shop has continued to progress and everyone can begin to see the evidence of the wonderful transformation taking place on site. This work is continuing and the current plans mean that we estimate that the work on the internal fit out of the shop counters and shelves will take place sometime around the middle of September. As with all building projects it is always 90% in the preparation and the work that doesn't always get seen – and a tremendous thanks must go to the Steering Group members and the very many volunteers from our community who are working so very hard to get this done and being incredibly generous with your time and energy. THANK YOU!

As you may also be aware, at the beginning of the project it was estimated that the total costs for creating the shop would be in the region of £40 - 42,000. This included the purchase and transformation of the Cabin and also the external work for the cladding, roof and an outside verandah area. As you also know, the current fundraising has reached £30,000. One unexpected impact of Covid-19 has been the significant slowing down of funding awards from organisations such as the National Lottery and the Cornwall Community Fund (both of which we were in the process of preparing bids for, however for several months now they have prioritised their funds for direct Covid-19 support work). We have identified some other potential funding sources to apply to, but unfortunately there will now be a delay of some months before we will know which bids have been successful. This means that the external building work (the cladding, roof and verandah) will now become 'Phase 2' of the building project and will be a focus during 2021.

The good news though is that progress will continue to be made on the transformation of the cabin itself, and the aim continues to be to open and starting to operate as a Community Shop at some point during this Autumn - albeit that the further external work originally planned will now take place during next year.

To ensure the Community Shop can become a reality, alongside the ongoing transformation of the cabin, the big focus over the next couple of months will be on the following areas:

Welcoming the volunteers to work in the Community Shop - the opening and running of the shop will depend on creating a team of brilliant volunteers for the shop. Work is taking place right now to finalise the shift patterns and rotas for volunteers and this will mean that the opening hours for the shop can then be set. As it gets closer to an actual opening date there will be welcome sessions arranged to introduce the volunteers to how the shop will work in practice. This will also need to take into account the requirements for social distancing and PPE, and we will need to manage any risks or concerns from volunteers too.

Finding more Funding - as mentioned above, the fundraising for the shop has already reached the amazing amount of £30,000. But inevitably costs have increased as we have progressed with the work. In order to complete the transformation of the cabin and set up the shop to be ready to open this autumn, there is now an urgent need to raise further funds in the region of £4000 and to achieve this quickly over the next couple of months.

We are currently progressing with a number of ideas and options for how this can be done. This includes opening up the share offer on an ongoing basis for local people to make their 'social investment' into the shop – please see Facebook and the website for more details of this www.stdominickcommunityshop.co.uk or ask Alan in the shop. We have already made an application to the Postcode Lottery for funding towards the costs for kit and equipment for the volunteers (including tabards, PPE etc.) although we won't hear about this until early November. We are also exploring several other fundraising ideas too. One of the many other things that need to be done in the background for the shop is to apply for the appropriate licence and have the arrangements in place to sell alcohol for off-site consumption (as the current shop does). This process is underway now, it is quite lengthy and time consuming, please see the notices referring to this elsewhere in the Parish News and also at the Community Shop site.

Finally, as we move closer towards the actual opening of the Community Shop, the most important thing to remember is that this will be a shared community asset for the benefit of all residents. As a Community Benefit Society, or CBS, this means that the Community Shop is owned by all the Shareholders who have invested in it, and will trade primarily for community benefit. In due course, as and when the shop generates a surplus, it will be the Stakeholders who will decide where this money is spent within our own Community. This means that our Community Shop provides a neat and effective way of practically supporting our own wider Community.
